



**Summary of Substantive Changes
between the updates dated June 3, 2011 and March 1, 2013 of
UL 962, “Household and Commercial Furnishings”
(Third edition, dated July 7, 2008)**

Presented to the IAPMO Standards Review Committee on April 8, 2013

General: The changes to this standard might have an impact on currently listed products. The major changes are:

- Added requirements for conductors subject to flexing (see Sections 19A and 41A)
- Added a marking requirement (see Section 68.7)
- Revised the reference to UL 8750 and added an exception for low voltage led arrays (see Section SA5.1)

Section 19A, Conductors Subject to Flexing: Added requirements for designs with conductors subject to flexing during normal use.

Section 41A, Conductor Cycling Endurance Test: Added an endurance test for conductors that are subject to flexing.

Section 68, Markings: Added a marking requirement to notify store personnel as follows:
[68.7 A furnishing intended to display merchandise shall be permanently marked where visible to store personnel “Certification of this display does not include the products that are on display.”](#)

Section SA5 Luminaires: Revised the reference to UL 8750 and added an exception for low voltage led arrays as follows:

A luminaire shall comply with one or more of the following requirements of the Standard for Low Voltage Lighting Systems, UL 2108; Standard for Flexible Lighting Products, UL 2388; Standard for Portable Electric Luminaires, UL 153; the Standard for Luminaires, UL 1598; [or the Standard for Light Emitting Diode \(LED\) Equipment for Use in Lighting Products, UL 8750](#), ~~or the Outline for Light Emitting Diode (LED) Light Sources For Use In Lighting Products, Subject 8750~~, as applicable to the light source.

[Exception: An LED array supplied by a Class 2 power supply is not required to comply with the Standard for Light Emitting Diode \(LED\) Equipment for Use in Lighting Products, UL 8750.](#)
